What do we know about adoptive family relationships?

- Conflict
 - Adoptees have higher conflict with mothers than nonadoptees
- Closeness
 - Research is contradictory
- Relationship Quality
 - Adoptees have lower relationship quality

Study purpose

To investigate the association between adoption-related variables & adoptees' relationships with their adoptive mothers during emerging adulthood



Guiding framework

- Emerging adulthood
 - 18 – 25 years old
- Major transition between adolescence & young adulthood
- What is unique about adoptive families & emerging adulthood?

Adoption-related variables

- Adoption Type (inracial vs. transracial)
 - Transracial paradox
 - Ethnic & racial socialization
- Adoption Feelings
 - Relationship between positive adoption feelings & various outcomes
- Adoption Interest
 - Adoption preoccupation
 - Birth parent search & reunion

Hypotheses

Adoption-related variables would account for a significant proportion of the variance in emerging adult adoptees’:

H1: Self-reported & observed Conflict with mothers

H2: Self-reported & observed Closeness with mothers

H3: Observed Relationship Quality with mothers



Sample: Sibling Interaction & Behavior Study

- 18.50 – 22.49 years ($M_{age} = 19.81$)
- 272 adoptee reports on mom; 273 adoptee-mom observations
- 69% Asian/Pacific Islander, 22% White, 4% Other/Mixed, 3% Hispanic, 2% Black

Measures: Self-report

Parental Environment Questionnaire (PEQ)

- Conflict ($\alpha = 0.91$)
 - 12-item Conflict with Parent subscale
- Closeness ($\alpha = 0.88$)
 - 12-item Involvement with Parent subscale

Measures: Observation

Sibling Interaction & Behavior Study Rating Scores

- Conflict
- Closeness
- Relationship Quality

Adoption-related variables

Adoption Type

(0 = inracial, 1 = transracial)

T t f F

1. It bothers me that I may have brothers and sisters I don't know.

T t f F

2. I think my parent(s) are happy that they adopted me.

T t f F

3. I feel good that I'm adopted.

T t f F

5. I wish I knew more about my medical history.

Opinions About Adoption Questionnaire

- Adoption Feelings ($\alpha = .88$)
- Adoption Interest ($\alpha = .90$)



Covariates

Biological Sex

1 = male, 2 = female

Negative Affect

Multidimensional Personality Questionnaire (MPQ)

Analyses

Five hierarchical regression analyses:

Step 1: Biological Sex & Negative Affect (covariates)

Step 2: Adoption Type

Step 3: Adoption Interest & Adoption Feelings



H1: Adoption-related variables will account for a significant proportion of the variance in emerging adult adoptees' self-reported Conflict with mothers

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Summary

- All models accounted for a significant amount of the variance in relationship indicators with adoptive mothers
- Adoption Feelings was significant in every model
